One was about Drúževo but had a mysterious phrase “Martha announce” in the file name. That sounded odd. The two files were very nearly the same length, but I opened both so I could compare them. Took me a little while to feel 100% sure, but it turned out to be *the long-missing file!* I am so excited to have it back! The woman I had recorded on that day and the next had given me some traditional songs, and some that she herself had composed. Finally I can see what I really heard there!

I was going to make a start on a new song post, but it got too late (2am), so I have to put that off for a day or two in order to do it justice. It’s a promise!
